During this one-day conference, students will be given the opportunity to present research on the life and work of a mathematician, the development of a particular mathematical field or problem, a specific institutional context in which mathematics was created, or the application of the history of mathematics to mathematics education.

Conference participants will also be given the chance to participate in a workshop on using the internet to conduct research in the history of mathematics and to hear a keynote address by Dr. Adrian Rice, of Randolph-Macon College, about research in the history of mathematics.
