- ☐ Failure to identify a load and go situation based on assessment data
- ☐ Failure to reassess the patient's condition
- ☐ Failure to complete scenario within 10 minutes of on-scene time
- ☐ Failure to perform adequate physical exam.
- ☐ Failure to provide all indicated treatments.
