ASAP's Growing Minds program offers Farm to School resources, training and technical assistance to schools and preschools in the Southern Appalachians. Farm to School includes school gardens, local food cooking, farm field trips, and local food in the cafeteria. Please visit our website – www.growing-minds.org - for more resources and information.

Free seeds for school gardens – ASAP's office is stocked with a selection of seeds from Sow True Seed (a local company) that grow well during the school year. Stop by to pick them up for your classroom or school garden. Gift cards for other school garden materials are available for a limited time.

Farm field trip mini-grants – Hands-on local food and farm experiences are a big part of Farm to School, and that is why ASAP offers annual farm field trip mini-grants to schools/preschools in our region (\$100 for the farmer, \$100 to cover travel and materials.)
